COPING WITH A CRISIS

24-hour Resource & Crisis Helpline

Anyone can call, text or chat to speak with our professionally trained staff and volunteers to receive helpful information, resources and referrals to local services.

Walk-in Assessment & Crisis Intervention Services

Through a face-to-face assessment, we provide crisis intervention and stabilization for Oakland County residents, 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Mobile Crisis Team

Our mobile team provides treatment to those in an immediate crisis, and connects them to ongoing treatment.

Victim Assistance

If you are a victim of a crime, we offer assistance to those seeking advocacy counseling and support 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Legal Clinic

We offer free legal advice, referrals, and counseling to those seeking legal help, twice a week, on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

FINDING A SAFE PLACE

Crisis Residential Unit

This is a short-term alternative (up to 14 days) to inpatient psychiatric hospitalization, for adults ready to actively participate in a recovery oriented treatment environment.

The Sanctuary

The Sanctuary is a 24- hour shelter for at risk youth aged 10-17, that aims to reunite families through counseling, skill- building and respite.

A Step Forward

We operate a safe living arrangement for homeless youth, between the ages of 16 and 17, who may stay while they attend school and maintain employment.

Graduated Apartment Program

The (GAP) provides supported subsidized housing for homeless adults aged 18-24. Residents are also provided counseling and case management.

Sober Support Unit

This is a voluntary 23-hour program, designed to monitor individuals who need detoxification services and have no health risks.

All services are provided by trained crisis interventionists or licensed professionals

COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Counseling Program

We offer free counseling for families with youth aged 10-17, for up to three months.

Support Groups

Survivors of Suicide Loss

This open group provides support for those who have lost a loved one to suicide

Survivors of Homicide

Provides support for those who have lost a loved one to homicide or drunk driving over the course of 12 weeks.

Growth and Healing

This healing initiative provides support for young women who are survivors of sexual assault or abuse.

Becoming a Love & Logic Parent

This six-week program provides support for parents with teenaged children through facilitated discussion.

Domestic Violence

This is a 10-week open group that provides support for women ages 18 and older who have been involved in an abusive relationship.

The Empower Initiative

Provides educational activities through a variety of expressive modalities, focused on mental health awareness, and addressing common dynamics facing children and families.
