Dear Staff, Supporters, and Those We Serve,

Oakland Community Health Network (OCHN) will soon begin directly operating crisis services at the Resource and Crisis Center in Pontiac. This change marks a new chapter for crisis care in Oakland County, but it does not mark the end of Common Ground's mission or our commitment to you.

Common Ground will continue to operate and serve our community. For more than five decades, our dedicated team has helped people move from crisis to hope, and that will not change. We remain here for you—ready to listen, assist, and advocate for anyone in need of emotional support, so no one feels alone.

Our services will continue, including:

- 24/7 Common Ground Crisis Hub Call us at (800) 231-1127 to access all Common Ground services and administration. Callers will receive compassionate care over the phone, telephonic crisis intervention if needed, and guidance to help people connect with services. This might include sending a mobile team to their location, connecting to a clinician to explore mental health concerns and/or a medical practitioner, and linking to ongoing community-based service providers.
- State-wide Virtual Behavioral Health Urgent Care is a virtual visit platform for children 12 years old and above, and adults across the State of Michigan who need urgent emotional or psychiatric support from licensed healthcare providers. - Michigan Crisis and Access Line (MiCAL) Michigan's 24/7 statewide crisis, support, information, and referral line. It is for all Michiganders and is meant for people in crisis or distress who do not know where to turn. MiCAL is an umbrella program for additional support lines.

- Genesee Mobile Crisis Services Genesee County Through community-based mobile crisis teams, serves residents of Genesee County in need of immediate assistance with mental health/substance use crises.
